- Minimum 121 Credit Hours
- Writing Intensive Course
- Minimum Cumulative G.P.A.: 2.00
- Minimum G.P.A. in the Minor: 2.00
- 30 credits hours of UMA Residency courses
- 9 credits of Upper-Level UMA Residency courses

- PRAxis II Test Code 20353 Special Education (*minimum score 157*)
- Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) Test Code 20522 for K-8 Special Education (*minimum score 166*) or Test Code 20524 for 7-12 Special Education (*minimum score 162*)
