Source and Purpose of Funds

On January 14, 2021 the Department of Education released notification that Congress approved a COVID Relief bill - which included an additional round of student emergency relief funds to be distributed to students. Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) the University of Maine at Augusta (UMA) was allocated \$3,537,103 from the US Department of Education (allocation referenced as HEERF II) of which \$675,763 must be used for student aid.

Eligibility Requirements

Consistent with the guidance from the U.S. DOE, eligible students include all students who were enrolled at UMA for the Spring 2021 semester as of 3/26/2021 and are eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), with the following exceptions:

- Student Enrolled in Spring 2021
- Non-degree seeking students
- International or DACA students
- Employees receiving UMS Employee Tuition benefits
- Early College students
- Department of Corrections Students

Distribution Plan

Consistent with the other institutions within the University of Maine System, of which UMA is a part, and in acknowledgement that every one of our students experienced disruption when COVID-19 forced all courses to be transitioned to online delivery, UMA will automatically distribute these funds to all eligible students. Award amounts will be tiered as follows based on the number of credit hours and demonstrated student need:

Undergraduate

.1 – 5.99 Credit Hours: \$125
6 – 11.99 Credit Hours: \$175
12+ Credit Hours: \$225

Graduate:

.1 – 5.99 Credit Hours: \$200
6 or more Credit Hours: \$300

Additional Award Based on Need:

High Need: 120
Med Need: 60

In some cases, emergency funds may have been supplemented with a portion of CARES dollars intended for institutional relief.

All distributions to student will be made via direct deposit or check. Because the IRS considers the CARES student funds as a “qualified disaster relief payment,” they are not considered taxable income.
